BURNS COUNTRY FLYERS FARM RULES





- Any request or order from the farmer should be complied with.
- > Any damage to the farm property must be reported to the committee as soon as possible
- > Farm vehicles are potentially dangerous and if directed by an operator you must move to safety.
- > Normally, cattle are grazing freely in the field from spring to autumn. It is acceptable to encourage the cattle away from the grass strip, but they should not be harassed directly. Members must not use a model aircraft to frighten any inquisitive beasts!
- > There is a lane next to the lower gate which is suitable for cars all year round. The field is only suitable for vehicles when it is dry and firm. Whilst it is acceptable to park in the field, members should use their discretion to avoid being bogged down. The farmer has no obligation to help pull cars out of the field. At harvest time you may be directed to park elsewhere.
- > Models must not be flown over or near the farm buildings or farm machinery. In addition, due care must be taken to avoid disturbing neighbouring properties to the North of the strip.
- ➤ Models must not be flown under the telephone wires East of the landing strip.
- > Gates should be closed at all times. Please observe the country code.
- > If a model comes down in a cultivated field, the searchers should stick to the tractor tracks in the field and minimize any disturbance to the crops.
- > No litter may be left in the field
- > Domestic pets are not allowed in the field
- > During the summer, when cattle are in the field, an electric fence protects the strip. Members should ensure that it is erected and live before they leave.
